Ensure a Bright Future for Your Pet

Part of being a responsible pet owner is planning for the care and safety of your pets should the unthinkable happen.

The Oshkosh Area Humane Society's (OAHS) first recommendation is to identify a trusted, willing friend or family member to care for your pet should you die or become unable to care for him or her due to illness or injury. However, we recognize this option is not always possible.

Pets are accepted to OAHS with the understanding that every effort will be made to place that animal in a new home as quickly as possible. However, the adoption program of OAHS is not one where animals are simply placed in the first available home. Our adoption counselors work to ensure a match between the pet and the adopter.

Talk with a trusted financial advisor, estate planner or attorney about the best way to provide support for the care of your pet through your will and/or trust in conjunction with the Oshkosh Area Humane Society.
